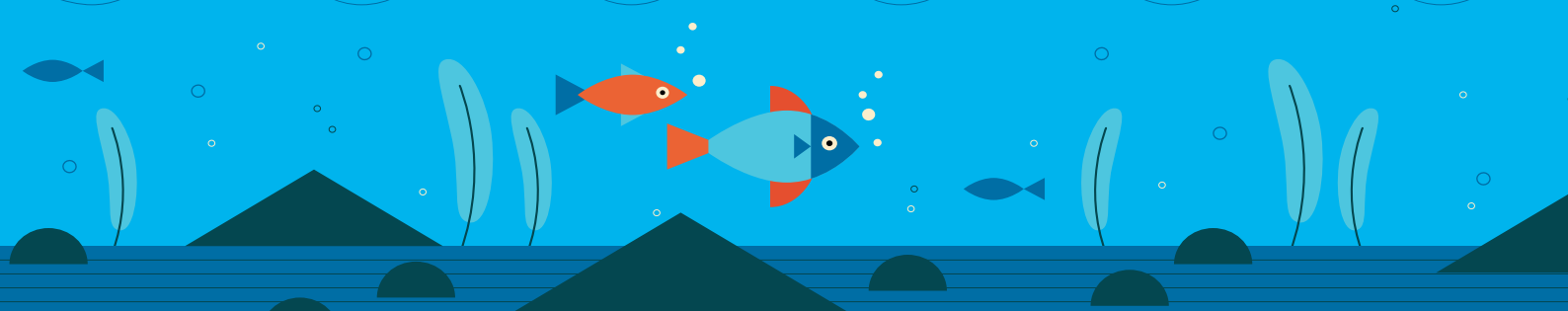

◆ THE WATER FOOTPRINT

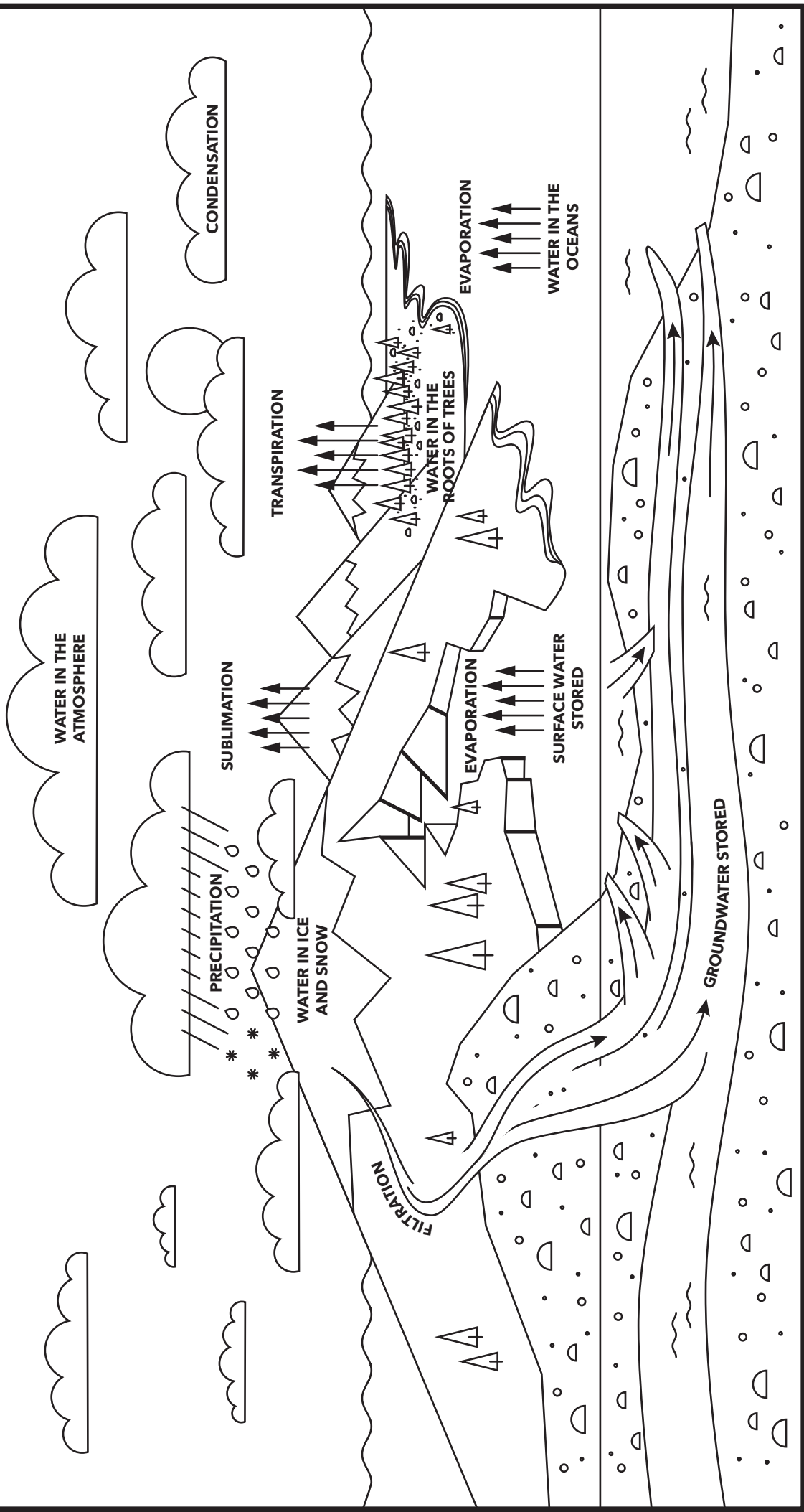
The water footprint is the total volume of water used from production to consumption of a product, plus the water required to treat the pollutants it produced.
